Progress Report

We are still waiting for Ofsted to revisit and judge our improvements. We are ready but still continuing to improve further. Our action plan shows that we have started all our intended actions and some additional ones as well.

- Our data continues to show that children attain and achieve well.
- Pupil progress interviews and provision maps helped to address any under achievement early.
- We are regularly reviewing how we use our Pupil Premium Grant and our work has been used to assist other schools. Our data shows that this gap is closing.
- Visits from our Local Authority advisers and consultants support our view that we have improved across the board.
- We have received a lot of training and now we need to embed all this good practice.
- We have an action plan to phase in the new assessment system when we have all the information we need.
- We launched our Christian values alongside our Behaviour for Learning. The children think behaviour around school is much better.
- When asked by Governors the children knew what they had been learning within each discrete subject e.g. 'history' rather than just 'topic'

Next steps:

- Carry on with the weekly monitoring of teacher's planning, marking, teaching, books and interviewing children.
- Ensure that children get enough regular 'fix-it' time to respond to feedback from teachers.
